## Mary L. Gleason Vail, 94, led many organizations

CLEVELAND — Mary Louise cleason Vail was raised with the ethic of giving back to the compunity. She spent a lifetime serving others.

She is listed in Who's Who in American Women and Who's Who in Ohio.

Mrs. Vail also served the Cleveland Welfare Federation as a trustee and member of the Executive Committee and the Central Budget and Policy Committee. She once chaired the federation's committee on the chronically ill.

She was a trustee of Cleveland Community Chest and United Appeal.

She was chairman of the Visiting Committee of Francis Payne

Bolton School of Nursing and vice president of National League for Nursing.

She was a member of the Regional Medical Program and a trustee with the Cleveland Center on Alcoholism, the Cleveland Society for the Blind and the YWCA.

She also served on Cleveland Heights Health Department Advisory Committee and was a member and president of the board of trustees at Laurel School. She was president of the Recreation League of Cleveland.

Her husbands, Charles B. Gleason and Herman L. Vail, are deceased.

Survivors include her daughter, Caroline G. Oberndorf of Cleveland; son, David Gleason of California; stepsons, H. Lansing Vail of Shaker Heights and Thomas V.H. Vail of Hunting Valley; stepdaughters, Jane Vaughan of Chagrin Falls; stepson, Stanton K. Gleason of Chatham, Mass.; seven grandchildren; five greatgrandchildren; and six stepgreat-grandchildren.
